after a while you just don't see it anymore. She helped me look at my house through different eyes and gave me a fresh perspective."

Gilmore said Lybrand spent one day rearranging furniture and moving accessories from one room to another until they achieved what Gilmore called "a unified look."

"She spiced it up, and I only had to buy two new throws — that was all," Gilmore said. "It was well worth what we paid [for the makeover]."

No sentiment lost

Lybrand says the redesign approach to home decorating is a great alternative for two reasons

"The biggest factor is the money factor. Redecorating can get very expensive if you have to buy everything new," Lybrand said. "The second factor is the sentimental attachment that people have to their possessions. A lot of times they don't want to give things up, even if they think it won't fit into their new design theme. With redesign, they don't have to."

For instance, Lybrand says she is working with a client in Islamorada who wants a tropical design theme. But the house is full of dark wooden antique furniture, and although she loves the heirloom pieces, the client was certain they would need to be replaced because they don't fit the common conception of island style.

Lybrand said she convinced the client that she could keep the antiques she loves and still achieve the fresh look she wants. By introducing a smattering of wicker or rattan and some other inexpensive tropical
